We have again received a very generous donation of time and materials for 31 more handmade lap blankets for the Veterans at Manteno. A thank you note has been sent to Pat Luchetta.





# The Palos Heights Womanis Club Thru the Years (1988 - 1998)

In approximately 1989, the Palos Heights Recreation Center provided space for the Woman's Club to create a community room. With funds raised by the Woman's club and labor supplied by the city of Palos Heights, two old classrooms were transformed into meeting rooms equipped with a new kitchen. The ribbon cutting ceremony and dedication of the Community Room was held on November 6, 1990 and the club was presented with a plaque of appreciation on March 9, 1991.

Throughout the 80's and 90's to the present time, Presidents would return from GFWC and IL 3<sup>rd</sup> District events with numerous awards from each of the Department areas as the Club continues in its efforts to raise funds for scholarships, donations to worthy organizations and enhance the beauty of our community with gifts of art.



Joan Meyers first conceived the idea of a "Gazebo in the Park". In the summer of 1992, the club began raising funds starting with a Garden Walk. With a theme of "Come to the Garden: an Invitation to Serenity" five local gardens were selected and box lunches were served at the Lake Katherine Clubhouse. Approximately \$2,000 was raised and banked in an account pledged for the gazebo. The garden walk became an annual event for raising gazebo funds along with a Gala Gazebo Ball and sales of t-shirts and stationery.

In 1994, under the leadership of then President Celeste Kappel, Rose Mateicka was appointed as Project Chairman and given approval to move forward on the Gazebo Project. A committee was formed to set goals and raise the funds required to make the Gazebo a reality. Through all of the Club's efforts, more than \$95,000 was raised and used to pay for the construction costs, three outside light posts, landscaping and benches. Engraved paver bricks form a promenade at the front steps to honor members, their families and others who contributed their support. A President's Walk was also included honoring the Woman's Club Presidents. To date, paver bricks can still be purchased in memory of a loved one or to commemorate a special occasion.

As this decade ends, the Club is preparing to celebrate their 60<sup>th</sup> anniversary with a gala anniversary ball, "Treasured Memories". Over the past 10 years, the club contributed close to \$100,000 to Club projects and philanthropies and in addition, contributions to community improvement projects such as the gazebo and the community room surpassed another \$100,000!
